



INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION OF


C O G N I T I V E A R T I S T R Y

The result was a joint exhibition, a vibrant tapestry of expressions by thirty young people from Greece, Latvia, Serbia, Italy, Romania, and Denmark, each bringing a unique cultural perspective. The entire project was an extraordinary celebration of youthful creativity and collaboration, bringing together diverse artistic projects to showcase the imaginative and transformative power of art.

The project "SHOW OFF - ART OF EXPRESSION: DANCE, THEATER AND COMEDY" was a real journey of creativity and international connection! From October 7 to 18, 2024, the quiet town of Ommen in the Netherlands became a place where young talents from ten European countries (Netherlands, Poland, North Macedonia, Romania, Bulgaria, Italy, Greece, the Czech Republic, Serbia, and Spain) gathered to create and learn together through the Erasmus+ project.






POLAND DZ MERCURY DRAMA THERAPY



The project "MERCURY - LIBERATION THROUGH DRAMA THERAPY" was a real opportunity for our students to explore new horizons of personal development and professional opportunities! Julijana Krstić, Tamara Kostić, Lana Zlatović, Kosara Marković, and Milica Gošić spent five days in the Polish city of Lodz, where, from October 14 to 19, 2024, together with their peers from Poland, Lithuania, and Hungary, they participated in intensive and inspiring workshops.










Through 25 creative sessions, young people used improvisation, role-playing, theater games, guided imagery, and storytelling to release emotional blocks and develop skills useful for future employment. Drama therapy enabled the participants to look at their emotions from a different angle and find the inner strength to overcome past traumas. In addition to gaining valuable experience, our students also obtained YouthPass certificates, a European document that confirms the knowledge and skills acquired through the Erasmus+ program projects.







